
CUBAN CULTURAL CENTER OF NEW YORK PRESENTS



Rituals & Harina: A sensitive film about the culture shock and hardships a woman faces as an immigrant and the rituals of her daily life, including her bond with her disabled son.

Manolo: Manolo, an arrival from the Mariel boatlift, remembers good times in Cuba while he sings, dances, and drinks beer. Although he lives in extreme poverty in Miami, he seems to be happy.

Memories of a Cuban Family: Yan Vega uses his own personal experience to construct the story of a revolutionary family in Cuba, the growing ideological disconnect faced by the parents and the children, and their eventual fate as immigrants. **Souvenir**: A melancholic cry denouncing poverty and repression in Cuba against those who justify the failures of the regime.
